

HASFIELD PARISH MEETING

Held at Tirley Village hall on Thursday 29th January 2026 at 7pm

1. Welcome to 8 Attendees.
2. Minutes of the Parish Meeting held on 25th June 2025 were read and accepted.
3. Treasurer's Report: Opening Balance at 1st April 2025 was £4279.32. After Precept, known fixed costs and accrual for hire of Tirley Village Hall for this Meeting the funds currently available are £4456.38. The Precept proposed by the Treasurer and seconded by the Chair for 2026/7 is £1750, a 5.4% increase amounting to just a 1.4% increase of 36p on a Band D Council Tax. The Treasurer also proposed that Amy Alexander, Chair, be added as Signatory to the Parish Bank Account, which was seconded by the Parish Clerk. It was also proposed by the Treasurer that he would use Online Banking which was seconded by the Parish Clerk.
4. Reports/Updates:
Tewkesbury Borough Councillor Paul McLain sent his apologies and also a report. Councillor Jill Smith gave an update and told the Meeting that Clare Skivington was our 'go to' person when dealing with T.B.C. There was no update from the **Flood Warden**. There were no crimes reported to the **Police**.
Footpath Warden Paul Bailey resigned - The vacancy was filled by Jo Wiseman.
The **Grit Bins** were full and in place.
5. Other Business
 - i. It was undecided whether there would be a Village Picnic this Summer.
 - ii. It was decided to put traffic cones at the 'blind' bend outside 24 Hasfield Road in order to slow the traffic using the lane. T.B.C. Councillor Jill Smith will write to Gloucester C.C. Highways regarding this matter.
 - iii. There were concerns regarding the proposed Glynhbrook Development at Redmarley and the impact it would have on our GP practice, and the volume of traffic using the A417 especially during flooding at Maisemore. The Parish Clerk will write to Forest of Dean Council to object.
